Pests, plants, butterflies, soil, water, are all topics located within the site; but, if you are looking for education, the first portal that we will investigate will offer a plethora of information for you to learn and explore - all for free! If you have been unable to complete all of your education hours this is the golden nugget for you. You can acquire all your education hours for the year! If you are researching a topic of interest this is a wonderful resource to turn to. If you are looking for something interesting to read, check out this site. To locate this “portal” – “link” – you will travel to the VMS Homepage by signing in to the site as you do for adding your hours. Next, look to the right side banner - the blue boxes. The first blue box lists your personal stats, hours and miles. Under that is the “State Links.” In this list there is the portal/link to “2018 Free Online Education Webinar List.” Take a moment to complete this quest and find something out about pests. Click on this link and scroll down until you locate the webinar: All Bugs Good and Bad Webinar Series: Alien Invasions, Zombies Under Foot, and Project: Environmental Stewardship: IPM – General. You then click on the link that is provided and your browser will take you right to the webinar. It does take a minute to load, and this particular one is an audio only. 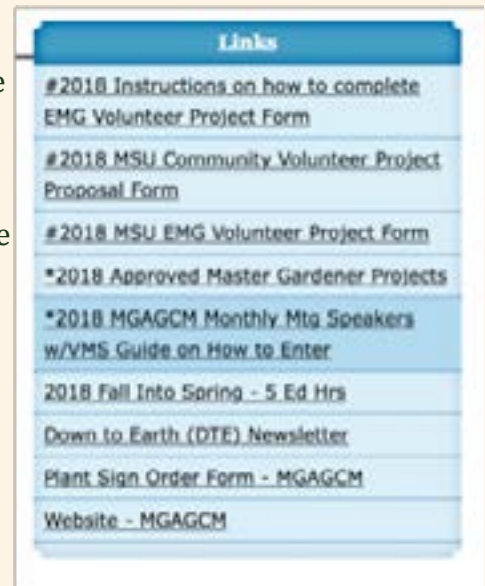

This will transport you to the MSUE Master Gardener website and directly to the Smart Gardening Homepage. Quest III: For this quest scroll down to Smart Vegetable; click on the “Learn how to plant a smart vegetable garden” portal/link. From the webpage you are transported to choose a topic of your interest and submit as your answer to Quest III.

Whew! You may be feeling a little overwhelmed by now with all this information and moving back and forth. Take a deep breath! All good adventures are challenging, but also exciting and bringing you new insights. This is such an adventure. After a brief pause return to the VMS homepage.

One of the most important sections of the VMS is all about you! Yes, you read that correctly. This is your profile. You completed your profile for the first time near the end of your Master Gardener training. You may not have gone back to this profile since that day. To explain the importance of this information, begin by thinking of it as a navigation tool. It is like the navigation you use on your car or phone to get from one place to another. When you choose areas of interest you are creating a link to be notified when important information is shared regarding that interest. For example, if you are interested in Garden Design and you have selected this on your profile, you would be notified if a class or conference were being offered on garden design.



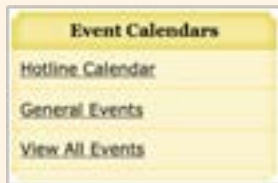
For this reason, all Master Gardeners are asked to choose MGAGCM as an interest. This will help navigate all notifications to you regarding our organization. If this is not selected, you may miss important notices on meetings, hours, events and statewide announcements. So now, let's take a stroll onto your profile page. Click the homepage and the first item in the upper left corner is "Edit your Profile". When you click on this you will access your profile information. Next review your current information and confirm that it is up-to-date. Next, scroll down through the list of interests selecting appropriate interests; and, at the very least select MGAGCM. Next, scroll to the bottom of the page and select "Save Information". Before leaving this page please take a moment to read the note on confidentiality. For Quest VI fill in the missing word in this sentence: "If you want to keep this information hidden from _____, please check the "Private" box."

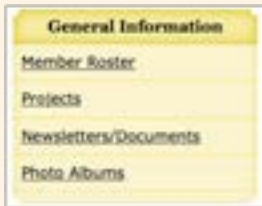

This left side banner of the VMS homepage is probably most familiar to you since it is the side you travel to when recording your hours. You may have even clicked on some of these links. But, for those who may not have visited here, note that this is where the calendars are located - the Hotline Schedule and the MGAGCM calendar. If you are wondering when and where the Master Gardener Picnic is - what you need to know is right here. While we continue our adventure here is a question to answer about last years picnic. Click on the "General Calendar," locate the July 22, 2018 date. You can find the July calendar by clicking on the back arrow for the month. Now, for the real fun, click on the words "Master Gardener Annual Picnic", this will take you to the details on the picnic. Continuing our interactive portion of this article here is Quest VII: What does your name badge give you when attending the picnic?

And, in case you are wondering, the All Events calendar is simply a combination of the Hotline and General Calendar.



The adventure continues with even more exciting discoveries! The "Member Roster!" This is a great tool for finding one of your friends from your project site, along with finding an email or phone number so you can reach out to them. After clicking the "Member Roster" link you will see two additional options; "View Member Interests" and "Email Members." This is where the information you added to your profile comes into the picture. Member interests, is just that, and useful when identifying others that might be interested in a particular project site, or if you are trying to locate a gardener who is working on a particular project site. The email option is what was mentioned earlier and is how to contact a group - especially helpful if you are a project chair. For our next interactive activity, begin by clicking on the "Email Members" tab. At the top of the new page it will say "Email Volunteers" and under that it will say "View Email History". Click on the "View Email History" and you will see a list of all the emails that have been sent. If you have not chosen any interests and in particular the MGAGCM interest you may notice some emails you have not received. Now for our continuing quest, find the email sent on November 9th from Diane Brady subject: Time is running out to report your completed EMG hours!

Jim Harrow was my mentor, friend, confidant and my “partner”, as he liked to call me. Things won't be the same without seeing Jim sitting at the Hotline desk, but my life, and others, have been enriched by this man. His faithful dedication, wisdom and love of the Master Gardener program helped make the hotline one of the best in the State of Michigan. It was not uncommon to have other counties call Jim to diagnose a problem they couldn't solve. Jim was proud to own Harrow Scapes, a landscaping business he founded and ran for ten years after his retirement from GM. Carrying on his love of gardening, he designed and landscaped (with a team of Master Gardeners) the gardens at Genesee County Library on Pasadena.



Whether young or old, Jim found a common interest with everyone he met, never meeting a stranger. He loved to be in social settings and was always willing to be the mischievous person in the group. His wit, and sometimes embarrassing sense of humor, will not be forgotten. He loved to share his knowledge on anything from garden questions, fine dining, wine tasting, archeology . . . the list goes on and on. I don't think there was anything this man didn't know something about. So, Jim, as we say goodbye, it's only until we meet again.

Jim Harrow passed away at Genesys Hospital at the age of 81 on December 13th. He leaves behind a brother and sister-in-law in Montrose and a sister in Florida. Honoring his wishes, cremation has taken place. A memorial service will be held at a later date. Memorial contributions may be made to the Master Gardeners of Flint (MGAGCM).

In addition, Alicia also devoted thousands of volunteer hours to the scouts, church, St. Robert's Elementary, Powers Catholic High School, and many community projects.

Alicia was born in Beckley, West Virginia and is survived by her loving husband of 49 years, David and her children. She will be missed dearly.

How often should I water my Poinsettia plant?



These colorful holiday plants need the soil checked before watering. Insert your finger down two inches into soil. If it's dry, it's time to water (wish I'd known this for the past two decades...). Read on here for more on Poinsettias: [University of Illinois Extension](#)

What is the viability of vegetable seeds that are old but still germinate?

Yes, old veggie seeds are still viable if they are stored in a cool dry place (preferably marked jars). With older seeds, keep the batches organized by the package expiration dates so you can test for germination of each batch. PRALINE APPLE BREAD

Esse Blackburn of Bellaire won the 2001 Apple Baking Contest sponsored by Zehender's of Frankenmuth, Michigan Living, Pioneer Sugar and the Michigan Apple Committee.

Her Praline Apple Bread topped more than 350 recipes submitted from around the state in an annual competition.

Ingredients

1 cup sugar
2 eggs
8oz. sour cream
2 tsp vanilla
½ tsp salt
2tsp baking powder
½ tsp baking soda
¼ cup butter
2 cups flour
¼ cup brown sugar
1 1/4 cups tart apples, peeled and cored
1 cup chopped pecans

Directions

*Oven: 350 degrees
9x5x3 inch loaf pan*

In a large mixing bowl, beat together sugar, sour cream, eggs and vanilla at low speed with an electric mixer until combined. Then beat on medium speed for two minutes. Stir together flour, baking powder, soda, and salt. Add to sour cream mixture, beat at low speed until combined. Stir in the apple and ½ of the pecans. Turn into a greased 9x5x3 inch loaf pan. Sprinkle with the remaining chopped pecans and press lightly into the batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 55 to 60 minutes (test with toothpick). Cool in pan on rack for 10 minutes. In a small pan, combine butter and brown sugar. Cook and stir until mixture comes to a boil. Reduce heat and boil gently for one minute. Remove bread from pan and drizzle top with brown sugar mixture. Cool. Makes one loaf
